THE INTERIM PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Church Family,

I want to update you on some important news regarding your church staff.

On June 1, Elyse Fairweather, NPC's current CE Director, will move to full-time Pastoral Assistant for the months of June and July. Her duties will include Children and Youth Ministry, worship assistance, some preaching, Adult Ed, and pastoral visitation. Elyse is uniquely equipped for and excited about these important roles. She knows the NPC congregation well and has almost completed her seminary education. This opportunity will allow Elyse to experience a broader range of pastoral duties, and I trust you share my absolute confidence that she will do an outstanding job.

Then at the end of July, Elyse will be leaving NPC for the next step in God's plan for her life. She will be giving her full attention to completing her seminary classes and fulfilling a hospital chaplaincy internship. Please keep Elyse in your prayers as she moves forward with God's good purposes beyond the NPC family. She will be greatly missed!

Additionally, also on June 1, I will be reducing my hours to three-quarter time. I believe that I will be more than able to ful-

fill my responsibilities to NPC on this basis during the final months of your search for your new pastor. We've done much good work together over the past 9 months and I see this shift in personnel budget as the right move to make. For example, this approach makes Elyse's change of status during June and July "budget neutral," creates some funding for your Pastor Search Committee to do its work in the most thorough manner possible, and in general strengthens the financial position of NPC for the remainder of 2014.

Looking further ahead, the wheels are turning to find a new seminary intern to replace Elyse. While Elyse is still with us, she will do all she can to make the transition to this yet to be determined new person a smooth one. Again, your prayers would be much appreciated.

As always, if you have any questions or comments, please talk with me or any of your elders. Thank you for keeping your church in your prayers.

RUMMAGE SALE!


The sale will commence in the fellowship hall at 12:00 after church services. Lunch will be available this year.

But she was also a Jew, and in 1942 she was arrested and deported to Auschwitz, where she died. For sixty-four years, this novel remained hidden and unknown. Her

daughter kept the manuscript for fifty years she decided to have it published in France, where it became a best seller in 2004.

thanking him for the gift of the old bell from the Ballard Presbyterian Church (now Northminster) and telling him that when funds were available a bell tower would be constructed. The letter continued: "This bell has rung its message of invitation to worship God for so many years that it gives the congregation great joy to know that it will soon be heard again, especially those older members who listened to its tones for so many vears."

On October 14, 1943, a letter went out to O.A. Wiggen In 1947 the memorial bell tower was erected as a gift from Mr. and Mrs. Wallace Hampton in memory of their son, Neil Hampton, who was killed in action November 2, 1944. [See the plaque by the office door.]
